Fish	 Humuhumunukunukuapua`a -Hawaiian Trigger Fish (<i>Rhinecanthus rectangulus</i>). The tiny, colorful fish with the long name - humuhumunukunuku apua'a -was designated as the state fish in 1985. The Rectangular Triggerfish is indigenous to Hawaii. It was selected after a high-profile campaign to educate the public about the kinds of fish that inhabit Hawaiian waters. According to legend, the humuhumunukuapua'a came about when the pig god, Kama Pua'a changed himself into a fish to escape the fire goddess, Pele. The fish has a thick skin to withstand the boiling waves through which he had to swim out into the deep sea. The Hawaiians say that this fish has always been able to make a noise like the grunting of a small hog. 	
Flag	Hawaii's state flag was adopted in 1894. It resembles the Union Jack of Great Britain because many of King Kamehameha's advisors were British and the islands were once placed under England's protection. The flag consists of eight horizontal stripes, representing the eight major islands, and the British Union Jack. It has served as the flag of the kingdom, republic, territory, and state of Hawaii.

The music was arranged by Captain Henry Berger, Bandmaster of the Royal Hawaiian Band, and was based on the Prussian hymn "Heil Dir Im Siegerkranz". It served as the national anthem of the Kingdom and the Territory of Hawaii from 1876 to 1893, until the overthrow of the royalty and the annexation of Hawai`i by the United States government. In 1967, the legislature declared it as the official song of Hawaii.
